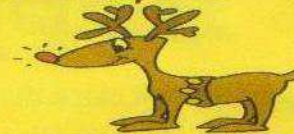


Competition

Lots of children in P5, P6 and P7 have commented in the class suggestion boxes that they would like one as well.

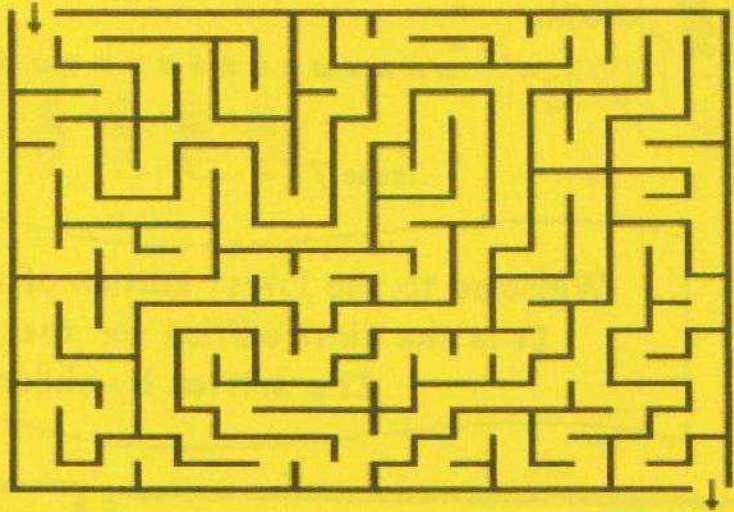
We think that this is a great idea so we are going to send out a questionnaire to all the children from P5 - P7 to find out exactly how popular this would be.
