

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

DE advise that it is essential that children attend school regularly and maintain a pattern of good attendance throughout their school career. Excellent attendance at school is important to allow a child to fulfil their potential Children who regularly miss school <u>without good reason</u> are more likely to become isolated from their friends and to underachieve in examinations. 95% Attendance	9 Days of Absence 1 Week and 4 Days of Learning Missed
90% Attendance	19 Days of Absence 3 Weeks and 4 Days of Learning Missed
85% Attendance	28 Days of Absence 5 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed

It is also very important that children arrive on time in the mornings so that administration tasks can be carried out efficiently, and to ensure children do not miss out on learning opportunities. We understand that there may well be genuine reasons for lateness but would encourage everyone to aim to be in school for 9am.

PARKING

As always parking in the immediate vicinity of the school is difficult. Please park with care and consideration, being careful not to block gateways/drives and being especially vigilant when reversing. A complaint has been made to the PSNI about cars blocking footpaths with parents and children being forced on to the road to get round cars. The PSNI will be monitoring the situation. Parking on yellow zig- zag lines is an endorsable penalty, which means three points and a £65 fine.

Parents/childminders etc should switch their engines off while waiting to reduce fumes. We encourage parents to say goodbye to the children at the gate if possible in the mornings and staff are on hand to assist where necessary.

CYCLING/SCOOTING TO SCHOOL

We are delighted to see so many children already cycling and scooting safely to and from school. We just wanted to take this opportunity to remind you of a few safety tips:

- Please ensure your bike/scooter is locked.
- Please wear a helmet when cycling/scooting.
- Please be aware of traffic.
- Please wear reflective clothing.
- Please remember that school is a pedestrian zone, therefore <u>nobody should be cycling or scooting in</u> school grounds.
